



Dear parents,

Welcome to a wonderful school year! I love teaching fourth grade at Oak Grove! We have a frog theme in our classroom, so you'll probably see a lot of frog-related things coming home!!

You will find our classroom rules and how I handle discipline in this letter. Please feel free to contact me with comments, questions or concerns.

There are four expectations/rules in our classroom. They are:

1. Be Safe
2. Work Hard
3. Be Respectful
4. Love Yourself

While I have very high expectations that all students will do the right thing at all times, I do have a management system for our room. Each student has a frog cut out with their name on it on the board. When one of our expectations/rules is broken, the student will move their frog into the appropriate pouch.

The first step is a verbal warning. Usually this is all that is needed to redirect someone that might have lost their focus. If a verbal warning isn't helpful for the student, they will have to move their frog into Hop One. You will see a note in their agenda with a frog sticker explaining the situation.

If the behavior continues, your child will move their frog into HOP TWO. You'll see two stickers (one sticker for each hop) and will receive an email from me.

The third step (HOP THREE) is when your child will call you to inform you of their choices. There will be three stickers in the agenda.

The final step (HOP FOUR) involves moving their frog into the final pouch and being sent to Ms. Jarman. Your child will have already called you (HOP THREE), so you will already be aware of a problem. There will be four frog stickers in the agenda.

I have never had a student get past Hop Two. At the end of the day, all frogs are emptied from the pouches and we start over the next day as a brand new day.

Once a frog has been put on the board it will take one week of not moving the frog for any reason, for it to go back off the board. All students should strive to get their frog off the board and keep it off for the whole year.

I believe more in working towards positive things rather than focusing on negative things. The students work together to earn extra minutes of recess, the opportunity to come back to the room on Friday for lunch, and they work as a class to determine the number of raffle tickets that I will pull each Friday for the "chance" raffle. I have a prize box that is full of awesome prizes. Every child will get to pick from the prize box at least once during the year.

We also have "Frog-Tastic Friday" and we are "Bucket Fillers." More information is available on our classroom website.

I have a website that I have worked very hard to create. It would be wonderful if you would bookmark it and refer to it as often as needed. I will have all weekly newsletters posted, a calendar of events (specific for our classroom), and information about the curriculum.
